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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to Indian Gaming Revenue Clearing Trust Fund; amending s. 17.71, F.S.; requiring the annual transfer of a portion of funds from the Indian Gaming Revenue Clearing Trust Fund for specified purposes; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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- Section 1. Section 17.71, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
 - 17.71 Indian Gaming Revenue Clearing Trust Fund.-
- (1) The Indian Gaming Revenue Clearing Trust Fund is created within the Department of Financial Services. The purpose of the trust fund is to act as a depository for a portion of the revenue-sharing payments received by the state under the gaming compact, as the term "compact" is defined in s. 285.710(1).
- (2) Funds shall be credited to the Indian Gaming Revenue Clearing Trust Fund as provided in subsection (3). Funds received from such revenue-sharing payments and deposited into the trust fund are exempt from the service charges imposed pursuant to s. 215.20.
- (3) Notwithstanding s. 285.710, the Department of Revenue shall, upon receipt, deposit 96 percent of any revenue share payment received under the compact as defined in s. 285.710 into the Indian Gaming Revenue Clearing Trust Fund within the Department of Financial Services. The funds deposited into the

28	trust fund shall be distributed, by nonoperating transfer, from
29	the Indian Gaming Revenue Clearing Trust Fund as follows:
30	(a) \$20 million to the Save Our Everglades Trust Fund
31	within the Department of Environmental Protection, for use in
32	accordance with s. 373.470(8).

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- (b) up to \$200 million in accordance with s. 380.095.
- (c) any remaining funds to the General Revenue Fund.
- $(\underline{43})$ Pursuant to s. 19(f)(3), Art. III of the State Constitution, the Indian Gaming Revenue Clearing Trust Fund is exempt from the termination provisions of s. 19(f)(2), Art. III of the State Constitution.

Section 2. This act shall take effect on July 1, 2026, if an Act Relating to Natural Resources or similar legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.
